# **Human Trafficking**

he Kalamazoo Anti-Human Trafficking Coalition is offering an awareness and training event on Saturday, September 29, from 1-5 pm at the New Day Community Church, 3600 Nichols Road. The event will include information on human trafficking and 30- minute training on how to recognize human trafficking and what to do when you suspect human trafficking.

Human Trafficking is not just a problem in other countries. It is occurring in the United States as well. Trafficked girls and women are forced to work as sex slaves in massage parlors which offer commercial sex across the United States. The LWV of New Jersey brought this issue to the LWV National Convention in June as a proposed program study. There were many recommendations for study or review and this issue was not passed. It is possible that we will see this issue appear for consideration at the next convention. In the meantime we have an opportunity to learn more about human trafficking in our community through the local coalition.

# **Texas Township Candidate Forum**

The League process facilitated an orderly meeting.

ownships in Michigan have traditionally been sleepy forms of local government—low population, part-time officers and trustees and limited office hours, if there was an office. Those were the days when the League of Women Voters of Michigan favored eliminating this form of government before abandoning that position. How times have changed!

For the third time since my move to Texas Township in 1972 a candidate forum was conducted by LWVKA. This time the forum was in response to the 2012 August primary election with only Republican candidates on the ballot and challengers for all positions on the Board of Trustees except the treasurer. This was the setting on July 25 where eleven candidates faced an audience of nearly 125 residents and responded to questions posed by the League as well as township residents. As one might expect even in an unusual controversial election, the League process facilitated an orderly meeting and all candidates were given an opportunity to present themselves and their positions by answering many questions over the planned two-hour event. Kalamazoo Valley Community College graciously permitted the League to use the Groves Center facility for the forum.

Thanks are due to township League members, Holly Hartwig, John Speier, Tracie Draznin, Janet Hansen, and to LWVKA members KC Miller for contacting candidates, to Paula Manley moderator, to Ken Manley timer, and to Connie Ferguson, Terry Hluchyj and Paula Aldridge who collected and reviewed audience questions. By their overwhelming response, Texas Township residents echoed Barbara Jordan's sentiment that "The stakes...are too high for government to be a spectator sport."

## The Assault on Voting Continues – This Time in Michigan

Early this year the Michigan Legislature passed a law requiring all voters to affirm their citizenship at the polls before they could receive a ballot (this is already done when one registers to vote). **Governor Rick Snyder** (R) vetoed the bill because he was concerned it would cause confusion for voters. Even though the law was vetoed, an initiative by **Secretary of State Ruth Johnson's** office seeking to affirm voters' U.S. citizenship led to confusion at the polls which resulted in some registered voters being denied ballots. <u>Read</u> more on this subject online.

## League Submits Comments on Hydraulic Fracking

The <u>League submitted comments</u> regarding EPA guidance for the use of diesel in hydraulic fracturing (fracking) activities.

## League, Coalition Partners Sends Letter to EPA on Air Toxics Standards

The League joined coalition partners in the environment and public health areas in sending a <u>let-</u> <u>ter to the Environmental Protection Agency</u> regarding the future of air toxics standards for Portland cement kilns.

#### League Asks House Members to Honor New Ethics Rules Regarding National Conventions

The League joined coalition partners in asking members of the U.S. House to honor <u>new con-</u> <u>gressional ethics rules</u> prohibiting members from participating in parties at the national nominating conventions that are paid for by lobbyists or lobbying organizations and are held to "honor" the members.

## League Joins in Supporting Lower Court Campaign Finance Disclosure Ruling

The League joined an <u>amicus brief</u> on an appeal to the DC Court of Appeals in the case of *Van Hollen vs. FEC.* The friend-of-the-court brief supports a lower court ruling that upheld strict disclosure requirements for the funding for electioneering communications.

## LWVUS Agriculture Position Review and Update

Delegates to Convention 2012 passed a motion to review and update the LWVUS Agriculture position, which was originally approved in 1988. The motion calls for a review that will investigate genetic modification, consolidation in the food industry, money in the regulatory process, and the consumer's right to accurate and comprehensive food labeling. In late 2012, the LWVUS Board will discuss the proposed study, define the scope and solicit committee members. Look for information later this year.
