President's Column

Get-Out-the-Vote (GOTV): Now is the Time!

As a GOTV initiative, the board of the LWVKA is asking each League member to reach out to at least FIVE (5) unlikely-to-vote or irregular voters and encourage them to go to the polls on November 6th and let their voices be heard.

These last few days before the election are the most important for encouraging people to vote. For "Each One — Reach Five," consider those family members, friends or acquaintances that may need some encouragement to vote. Contact them with handwritten "please vote" letters or postcards, phone calls, emails or texts—whatever method of communication is apt to work best for the individual.

Where it may be helpful, offer advice about having a plan to vote (i.e., time of day that works best). If transportation is an issue, remind them that **Uber** will provide **free rides**, the political parties may offer rides and other organizations are also available to give rides. Maybe assistance with childcare would be helpful, or they need information about their polling place or the ballot proposals (see article below). Direct them to the paper voter guides or Vote411.org so they know what to expect on the ballot and can be prepared before they go to the polls. If they would like companionship, offer to go with them to the polls.

For the primary election this year, voter turnout was nearly 30%, an improvement over past primaries. Midterm elections are not known for high turnouts but with your help, **"Each One—Reach Five"** we can build on the primary momentum. Let's show what LWVKA can do to improve the vote!

LWVUS Update

On National Voter Registration Day September 27th, LWVKA was one of over 400 Leagues in over 40 states participating in registering voters and giving out voter information.

The League of Women Voters Education Fund is partnering with several nationwide organizations to reach potential voters:

- ProPublica, a national nonpartisan media outlet, will be incorporating Vote411 candidate information, as well as other voting information, into personalized messages in their Users Guide to Democracy. These messages will be available to their hundreds of thousands of readers nationwide.
- Lyft offices in selected communities are interested in distributing League voter education and get-out-the vote materials.
- Seattle/King County LWV and Starbucks have launched a Ballots and Baristas program. Starbuck managers in 40 locations nationwide are encouraged to work with local leagues to host special events promoting voter empowerment and community conversations.

HR 5308, introduced by Rep. Barbara Lee, proposes a series of quarters featuring a 19th Amendment icon on one side and a noteworthy woman from each state and territory. If you wish to contact your representative in support of this bill, there is a template on the LWV League Management Site.
