## **Looking Ahead**

here's no end of possibilities for League study, education, and advocacy. Selecting from among the many options is always a challenge. With that in mind, the Board of Directors decided it's time to write a new roadmap – a strategic plan to guide our choices over the next few years.

In making this decision, the Board confirmed that our vision and goal frameworks, created in 2007, are still relevant. The frameworks serve as an excellent foundation for developing future strategies, just as they have since the initial plan was adopted. Our work now is to commit ourselves to actions that will bring the vision to life for the next few years.

The Board outlined two phases, leading to adoption of a three-to five-year plan:

#### Phase 1

Small teams of members brainstorm and research potential strategies for the focus areas.

#### Phase 2

Those teams, with others, gather to review the possibilities, consider refinements to the vision and focus areas, and select strategies over a three- to five-year timeline.

#### **Vision**

The League of Women Voters of the Kalamazoo Area will be the premier catalyst to invigorate the democratic process, advocating for open and responsive government which is accountable to all and acts with responsibility to the future.



## **News From National and State**



**U.S. District Court Rules in Ko-**bach v. Election Assistance Commission On March 19, the U.S. District
Court for Kansas issued a ruling in Kobach v.
U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) that
approves the documentary proof of citizenship requirement for voter registration by the
states of Arizona and Kansas. In a press release (see lwv.org), the League called the ruling "a harsh decision that will hurt voters for
no real reason."

**League Urges Presidential Veto on H.R. 2019** The League joined a letter asking President Obama to veto H.R. 2019 which repeals public funding for party presidential nominating conventions. H.R. 2019 would repeal the public financing system for presidential candidates and party nominating conventions under the guise of providing funding for a 10-year pediatric cancer research initiative. In reality, the legislation authorizes the funds for the research initiative, but it does not appropriate the funds for use.

# League Encourages Treasury Department, IRS to Move Forward with Proposed Regulations The

League joined other organizations in sending a <u>letter to the U.S. Treasury Department</u> and the IRS, encouraging them to move forward with the rulemaking process to provide guidance for tax-exempt social welfare organizations on candidate related political activities. The League previously sent comments to the IRS regarding the proposed regulation.

## Submit a Comment to the Environmental Protection Agency $\ensuremath{\mathrm{The}}$

EPA has extended the deadline for public

comments for the proposed federal carbon pollution standard for every new power plant built in America. **The new deadline is May 9, 2014.** Submit a public comment to the EPA in support of the standard and <u>your voice will be part of the official record.</u>


