

LWVKA Continues to Support Housing for the Homeless

"Vote YES for Kids!" proposal coming up in November.

ote YES for Kids! is the new name for the HOMES Coalition. As we have done in the past, LWVKA continues to support this organization and the efforts to end homelessness in Kalamazoo County.

Beginning in 2011, this coalition of organizations and individuals has worked to expand funding for the Kalamazoo County Local Housing Assistance Fund (LHAF).

The first stage was to inform the community of the successes of the LHAF and why it should continue and hopefully grow. Coming from every one of the nine school districts in Kalamazoo County, 1,586 school-age children experienced homelessness during the 2013-14 school year. If county voters "Vote YES for Kids!" in November, at least 100 of these children's families each year will have a place to call home.

On July 21, Kalamazoo County Commissioners voted to put a .1 millage on the ballot in November. The cost to a homeowner with a house valued at \$100,000? Just \$5 a year.

If passed, funds will provide rapid rehousing and support services for families through local housing non-profits. The nine public school districts in the KRESA area already have the services of a Homeless Liaison, who will refer families. The Kalamazoo County Public Housing Commission, chaired by **David Anderson**, will distribute the funds to local housing nonprofits through an RFP process.

Endorsing organizations to date are: Community Advocates, First Congregational UCC, League of Women Voters of the Kalamazoo Area, ISAAC, Michigan United, Open Doors Kalamazoo, Social Justice Coordinating Committee of People's Church, YWCA of Kalamazoo, and the 60th District Service Office.
